Vocational Placement Opportunities in Aruba: 2024-2025

Tur Cos Ta Posibel is thrilled to announce our vocational placement offerings for the 2024 – 2025 academic year in Aruba. We are equipped to host Erasmus+ Vocational Traineeships and UK Turing Scheme placements, as well as job shadowing opportunities for vocational tutors. Our diverse programs are designed to cater to a range of needs and interests in the vocational sector

Placement Options

1. Group Short-Term Placements

- **Duration:** Typically two weeks, but adaptable to your curriculum needs.
- **Details:** Students can be accompanied by tutorial staff for the entire placement or just for the initial phase.
- **Cost:** €1,500 or £1,250 for a two-week project in shared rooms.

2. Individual Placements

- **Duration:** 2 to 12 months.
- **Eligibility:** Graduated students or apprentices.
- **Details:** Participants will gain hands-on experience in their field of study or apprenticeship, allowing them to experience different working methodologies and cultural contexts.
- **Cost:** €2,000 or £1,700 per month in rooms for two people.

3. Job Shadowing for Teaching Staff

- **Purpose:** Enhance teaching delivery by gaining insights into different aspects of your field from another cultural perspective.
- **Accommodation:** Costs may vary based on living arrangements. Staying in our youth house keeps costs the same.

Planning Visits

We encourage institutions to arrange planning visits of at least 5 days to experience firsthand what your learners will enjoy. We will customize a planning visit program to fit your institution's needs and interests.

Customization of Vocational Offers

While we provide a wide range of vocational offers, we can customize our programs to suit your institution's needs. If you're looking for a specific vocational field not listed in our brochure, please get in touch.

Inclusion & Support

Tur Cos Ta Posibel actively promote **inclusion and diversity**, We can host students, trainees, apprentices and staff with additional support needs but should know the profile in advance of planning the activity (additional costs or the request to have accompanying staff for the full duration of placement may be required). Please be aware Aruba is not well prepared for participants with mobility difficulties or disabilities.

Benefits of Our Placements

Important Information

Workload: While participants will visit attractions and engage in cultural activities, this is not a vacation. Days will be busy, with weekends free for relaxation.

Longer Stays: Placements over three months require immigration paperwork, including a police-issued paper of good conduct.

Accommodation: Participants in youth housing will handle their own cooking, cleaning, and laundry, fostering independence skills.

What you are responsible for

Travel: Most flights to Aruba require a layover in Amsterdam, the USA, or Latin America, but direct flights are available from London (BA & TUI) and Amsterdam (KLM & TUI).

Tourist Tax: A \$20 tourist tax is required when entering Aruba, collected via the Aruba ED card.

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Animal Care

About the project

Tur Cos Ta Posibel provides short placements in Aruba for animal care students, covering fields such as animal husbandry, veterinary studies, and conservation. Suitable for both apprentices and college-based students, our program accommodates groups of 8 students and 2 tutors from vocational or technical colleges for 2-3 weeks.

Projects are tailored to match learners' study levels and specific fields, including animal husbandry (working at the donkey sanctuary and understanding the operations of an animal sanctuary), veterinary skills (working alongside AWAA, a local veterinary practice helping to neuter stray dogs and cats), and working with local dog trappers (catching street dogs for neutering and treatment).

Our aim is to provide hands-on experience and cultural immersion, enhancing skills and understanding of animal care practices in Aruba. Students engage in various activities, such as the general running of the Donkey Sanctuary and care of its 130+ donkeys, anesthetizing stray animals for neutering, administering medicine where needed, and capturing stray dogs for treatment. This program offers practical learning opportunities and deepens students' knowledge of animal care in Aruba's diverse environment.

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Creative Arts

About the project

Tur Cos Ta Posibel partners with local arts organizations to offer creative arts placements in cultural settings across Aruba. These tailored programs can meet the needs of participating institutions and can include:

- Learning Aruban art forms
- Exploring the impact of murals in St. Nicolas, with opportunities to assist in mural or mosaic creation
- Participating in Dream Dare Do, a summer program supporting Aruban youth through creative arts and dance workshops, in partnership with Popcorn Club and Gange De Arte
- Engaging in Aruba Art or Fashion Week, where St. Nicolas hosts large-scale professional events, which students can join (in partnership with Artisa)

Additionally, art students can visit Aruba's galleries and support local organizations by delivering art workshops for children, the disabled, and long-term trainees. There are also opportunities to work with prisoners or ex-prisoners involved in the probation service.

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Construction

About the project

Tur Cos Ta Posibel provides short placements in Aruba for construction trade students, covering trades like bricklaying, carpentry, plumbing, painting, and maintenance. Suitable for both apprentices and college-based students, our program accommodates groups of 8 students and 2 tutors from vocational or technical colleges for 2-3 weeks. Projects are tailored to match learners' study level and specific fields, including joinery (e.g., playground renovation), wet trades (e.g., Cunucu house restoration), and plumbing (e.g., creating an outdoor bathroom in a shipping container).

Our aim is hands-on experience and cultural immersion, enhancing skills and understanding of construction practices in Aruba. Additionally, we host mixed trade groups, like plumbers and carpenters in one cohort. Students engage in various activities such as renovating a wooden playground or tiling a community centre bathroom. They also visit local sites such as WEB, the water desalination plant, understanding purification processes. This program offers practical learning opportunities and deepens students' knowledge of construction in Aruba's diverse environment.

About the project

Tur Cos Ta Posibel offers dance placements for individual graduates (2-12 months) or trainee groups (2-3 weeks), working with us and local partners. Depending on the curriculum, participants can engage in choreography, dance teaching, leading workshops in schools, and working with youth and the elderly. All of this takes place in a nation where dance is deeply embedded in cultural traditions.

Students will learn about Aruba's rich history of dance, from its origins in slavery to its significant role in the annual carnival, which is a vibrant celebration of culture and heritage. They will co-deliver workshops, share their own dance styles from their home countries, and gain new skills and perspectives through immersion in Caribbean culture.

Aruba boasts a diverse dance scene, including salsa, merengue, bachata, kizomba, and carnival dances, each showcasing its unique cultural heritage.

Your students will become part of Aruba's dynamic dance community, contributing to and learning from a vibrant culture where dance is a powerful form of expression.

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Early years

About the project

Tur Cos ta Posibel provides placements in Aruba for early years students who will be working in a local school which currently has provision from birth to 2nd grade. Suitable for both apprentices and college based students from vocational or technical colleges for 2-3 weeks and can accommodate groups of up to 8 students and 2 tutors. Projects are tailored to match learners studies.

Our aim is to provide hands on experience and cultural immersion. The Mornings centre around general education (maths, English, science etc) for those of school age and educational games/activities in the nursery classes. The afternoons are 'after school' provision and as such they are joined by children up to 15 yrs from other local schools. There are a variety of activities in these sessions, art, music, show and tell, choir practice, nutrition and more. Groups will be expected to plan an activity for one of the afternoons each week which they will deliver and support, ideally something typical to their home country. Lunch will be provided by the school but trainees can choose to take their own if they prefer.

About the submarine project

Tur Cos Ta Posibel provides short placements in Aruba for mechanical engineering students. Suitable for both apprentices and recent graduates, our program accommodates individual learners seeking to further their education after completing their college studies, for a period of 4 to 9 months.

Projects are tailored to match learners' studies and specific fields, including the mechanical maintenance and general upkeep of a submarine.

Our aim is to provide hands-on experience in this unique field, along with cultural immersion, enhancing skills and understanding of mechanical engineering.

Participants also visit local sites, such as WEB, the water desalination plant, to understand purification processes.

This program offers practical learning opportunities, deepening students' knowledge of engineering in Aruba's diverse environment. If the project is longer than 6 months, there may be an opportunity to gain a scuba diving qualification (PADI).

Projects are tailored to match learners' study levels and specific fields, with one week on the day shift handling incoming repairs and one week on the afternoon/evening shift focusing on scheduled maintenance work.

Our aim is to provide hands-on experience and cultural immersion, enhancing skills and understanding of mechanics practices in Aruba, including the opportunity to work on unique vehicles like a submarine. Students participate in activities such as general servicing, diagnostic repairs, and assembling buggies that arrive in parts. They also visit local sites like WEB, the water desalination plant, to understand purification processes. This program offers practical learning opportunities and deepens students' knowledge of mechanics in Aruba's diverse environment.

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Sport coaching

About the project

Tur Cos Ta Posibel provides short placements in Aruba for sports coaching vocational students. The placements can be sport-specific; for example, football coaching students will be engaged in football camps, football coaching in schools, and after-school and weekend club activities.

We can also offer opportunities to engage with specialist activities, such as sports for people with disabilities, over-50s activities, and sports programs in prisons or on military bases.

Students who are studying more general sports coaching will be offered a multisport provision, which could include activities with our local community partners in athletics, swimming, triathlon, and gymnastics, for example.

Our programs are individually tailored to the student's educational journey and the curriculum they are studying. Students will be immersed in grassroots sports provision and will also have opportunities to volunteer at local sports events, such as road races, triathlons, or school sports programs.

Tur Cos Ta Posibel can host individual graduated trainees (2–12 months) or trainee groups (2-3 weeks) on specialized travel and tourism placements. We collaborate with education providers to agree on the complete programme content, ensuring it aligns with participants' academic goals.

Activities will include extensive exposure to the Aruban Tourism Industry, including visits and participation in cultural activities, festivals, and shows. Placement opportunities are available at Fundacion Museo Arubano, where trainees can immerse themselves in the island's cultural heritage.

Depending on timing, activities may also include involvement in the Aruba Art Fair, Aruba Carnival, or other annual touristic events.

Participants will not only visit tourist attractions but also engage behind the scenes, contributing to their creation. Graduated trainees can spend 2-12 months placed with one or more of our tourism partners, gaining hands-on experience and valuable industry insights.

The last bedroom can sleep up to 4 people in two double beds (1 king bed and one sofa bed) there is also just about space for an extra single bed if necessary, this bedroom leads into the washroom and also to an additional full bathroom. The house contains a laundry where you can wash your clothes and ample space outside to dry them.
